Primary Care Update Report

July 2017

1. Introduction

- 1.1. This report provides the Primary Care Co-Commissioning Committee (PCCC) with an update on national and local Primary Care news and information, highlighting areas not covered elsewhere on the agenda.

2. General Practice

- 2.1 Quality and Outcomes Enhanced Services Transformation (QOEST). The plan is now in the implementation phase with performance being monitored through quarterly assurance meetings.

3. Update from the Primary Care Group (Estates and Technology Transformation Fund)

- 3.1 The bid against the Estates and Technology Transformation Fund (ETTF) for the West locality has been updated following the 1st stage of the due diligence by the NHS England Estates team. The Project Initiation document (PID) will receive further scrutiny at the Sustainability and Transformation Partnership (STP) meeting before being assessed by the Regional Office of NHS England. The North development is still in the early planning phase but is also being progressed by the CCG.

4. GP Access Fund (GPAF)

- 4.1 The scheme is delivering extended access to routine General Practice across the borough, 7 days a week. At the weekends the federation is collaborating with the GP Out of Hours service to ensure that it is fully utilised. The federation is in the process of finalising the new service model which will provide improved triage, clinical advice and nurse led clinics including Cervical Cytology, operational by August 2017. When this new model is implemented the service will be fully compliant with the national core requirements.

5. Primary Care at Scale

- 5.1 As part of transformation work operating across Blackburn with Daren and Pennine Lancashire, meetings are being held with providers to develop primary care at scale. There is funding available from NHS England (approximately £1 per head) to enable this work and is focussed on the development of primary care networks. These networks are based on our 4 neighbourhoods (registered populations of 30-50,000), with GPs, community nursing, social care etc working in an integrated way to manage more patients out of hospital.

6. Practice Changes

- 6.1 Dr Patel has now gone into partnership with Dr Jag at Hollins Grove surgery. Dr Patel is looking to provide a satellite service for patients in association with the Family practice at Barbara Castle way

as part of this development. The CCG is working with the practice to ensure the best service for patients whilst ensuring resources are utilised effectively.

- 6.2 Dr Zafar (Roe Lee) has now gone into partnership with Dr Marlborough (Montague practice) and is looking to merge both services subject to conversion of current contracts (PMS / GMS).
