PERSONAL MEDICAL SERVICES (PMS) PREMIUM REVIEW – CONTRACT TRANSITION

1. Introduction

1.1 In February 2014, NHS England issued guidance setting out the requirement for all Personal Medical Services (PMS) contracts to be reviewed by March 2016. The aim of the review was to secure best value from future investment of the ‘premium’ element of PMS funding and to apply the principles of equitable funding to PMS practices.

1.2 This table below updates the primary care co-commissioning committee on the contract status of PMS practices and the expected financial year in which the practice is expected to transition to a General Medical Services (GMS) contract.
